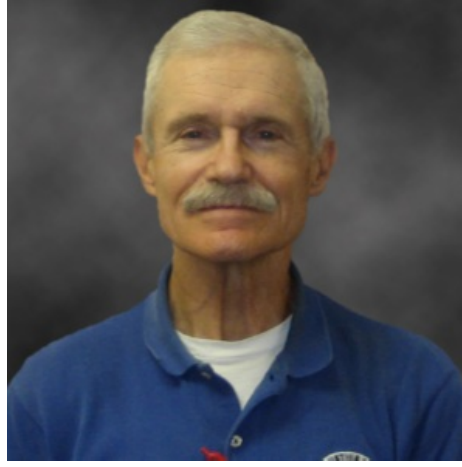

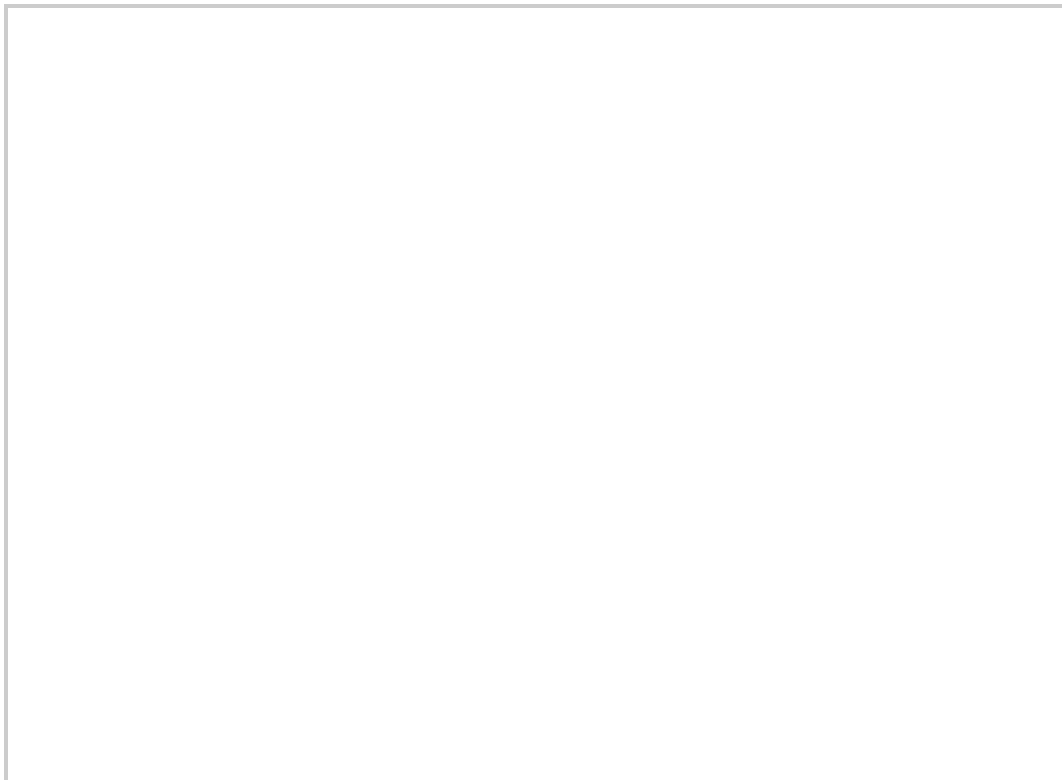
Needs II

SEPAC Presents AIESA to Fish Island Community Alliance

Fish Island Community Alliance representatives attended SEPAC's November meeting to accept a 2022 Anastasia

Island Environmental Stewardship Award.

Fish Island Community Alliance is a non-profit group that has been instrumental in preserving the 33-acre City of St. Augustine-owned “Fish Island” land on the north side of 312 (separate from Fish Island Preserve on the southside of 312) as a passive park. They also aim to educate/empower residents on environmental issues. The group focuses on resilience, sustainability, and flood mitigation as well as protecting wildlife and their habitats on Anastasia Island. Elizabeth Smith founded FICA, which boasts more than 650 members.

SEPAC presents the AIESAs each year to recognize individuals, businesses, groups, and educational institutions that are working to protect the Island’s natural resources and enhance its ecosystem.

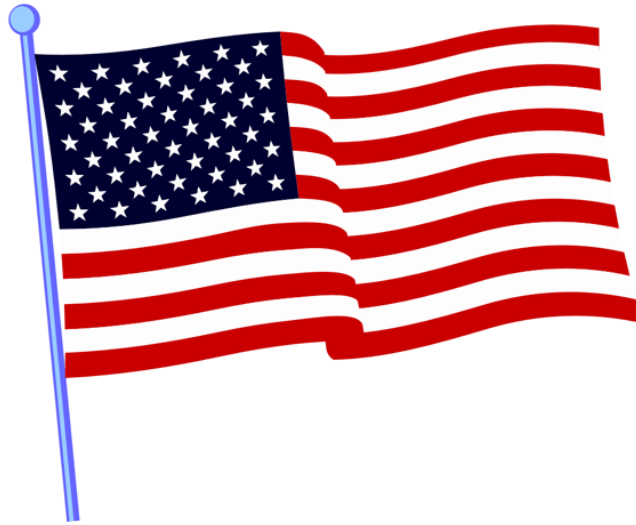

American Flag Rescue Program

The American Flag Rescue (AFR) program was initiated in 2019 after St. Johns County Solid Waste Management staff observed worn and damaged American flags in drop-off garbage containers at the Tillman Ridge facility. Although some flag collection containers already were in place in several stores that sell American flags, more collection points were clearly needed. The initial shipment of new flag collection boxes was funded by local radio personality Kevin Geddings. These units were placed in St. Johns County libraries. Of the nearly 1,000 flags collected in 2020, about 10% were reusable and these are available to the public. Damaged flags are retired according to established protocols by local Scout troops and veteran's organizations. An American Flag booklet provided by Supervisor of Elections Vicky Oakes is also available. Flags can be dropped off at City of St. Augustine Beach City Hall.
